Description

A finely modelled solid silver figure of an Irish Setter, crafted in Germany around 1905 by the renowned sculptor and silversmith Berthold Müller. The dog is shown in a naturalistic walking pose, with excellent attention to anatomical detail, textured coat, and expressive head, reflecting the high standards of German silver of the period.

The figure is cleverly constructed as a novelty table piece, with the head and body separating to reveal a hollow interior, most likely intended originally as a table accessory. When assembled, the joins are discreet and the overall form remains elegant and lifelike.

An evocative and collectible piece, combining charm, craftsmanship, and functionality, and a fine example of early 20th-century German silver. Ideal for collectors of animal silver, continental silver, or distinctive decorative objects.
